

Watering Trees, Shrubs and Evergreens for Winter Survival

Watering trees and shrubs is still the single most important fall chore this year, so don't put the hose away yet!

Water deeply and thoroughly. The Ross Root Feeder, will deliver water directly to the roots when the hose is connected to it. You can also water effectively by placing the hose at the base of each plant and letting it trickle for 15 minutes.

For large trees, water around the entire drip line so as to deliver moisture to all the roots. Give special attention to plants installed this year and last.

Continue watering right up to hard frost. If the winter remains balmy and dry, keep up the watering through the winter. If we have a cold winter with little snow, you can add moisture to trees and shrubs right on through the cold months by piling shoveled snow around the base of each plant.
